

Extract from Agreement for the Supply of
water to the Troops at the Castle Barracks Galway

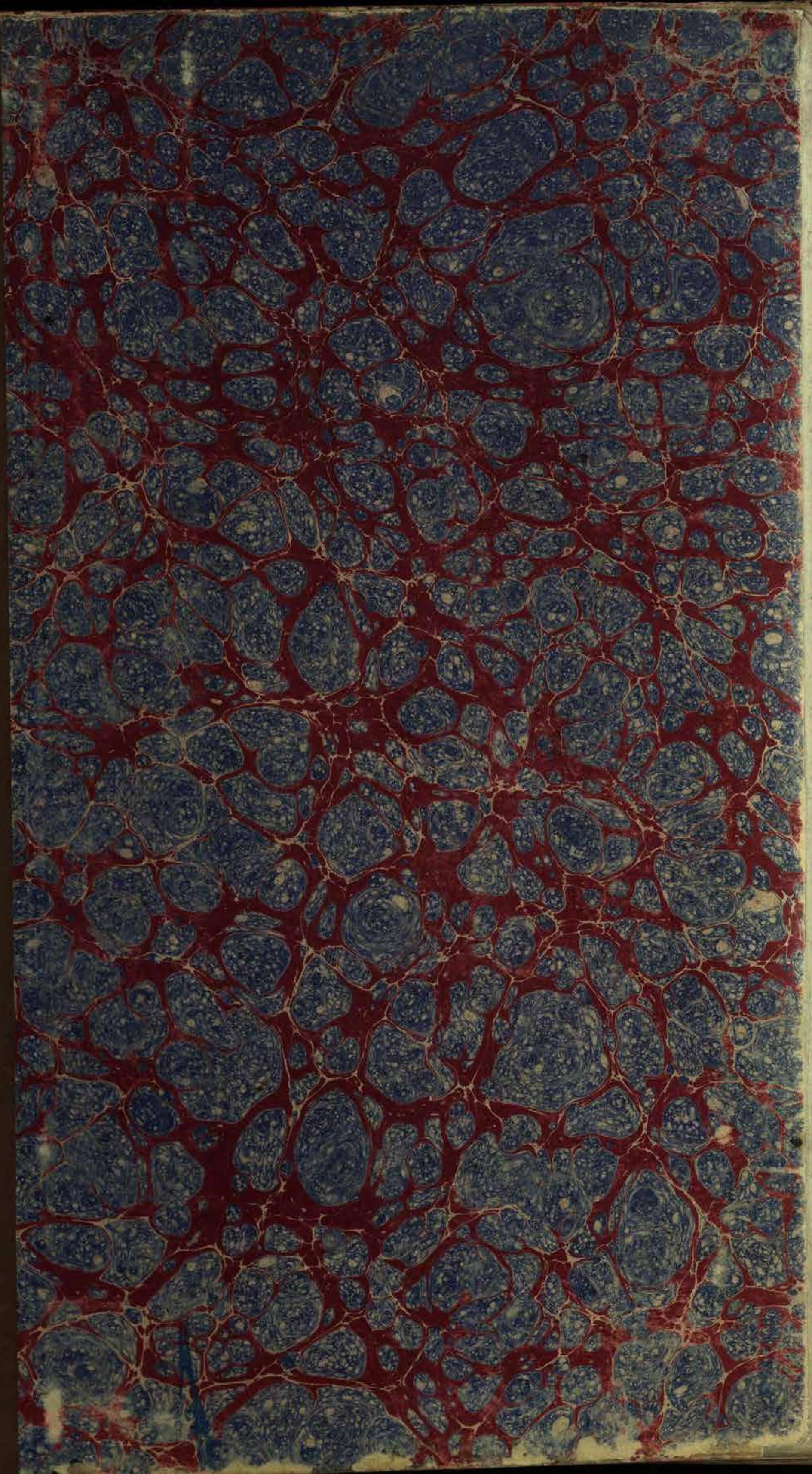
We the Galway Town Improvement
Commissioners hereby agree to supply such
water as may be required at the Castle
Barracks, Galway on the following terms

- Agreement
dated
Galway 3.6.80
Dublin 15.6.80
1. That payment will be at the rate
of Fifteen Pounds Sterling per annum
payable quarterly in arrear, to commence
from the date on which the water is
actually used.
 2. That the supply of water will be of
good quality and force (force not exceeding
eighty men and forty-four horses, or the
equivalent of that force, the consumption of two
horses being considered equal to that of three
men or women, and of one adult equal to
that of two children under fourteen years
of age). The supply to be not less than
twenty-five gallons per man.
 3. In the event of the total force being
at any time in excess of the strength named in
paragraph 2, an additional payment to be
made in proportion to such increase, should
the force be reduced to less than twenty men
the payment to be reduced to Five pounds per
annum, and it shall be altogether in the
event of the whole force being withdrawn.

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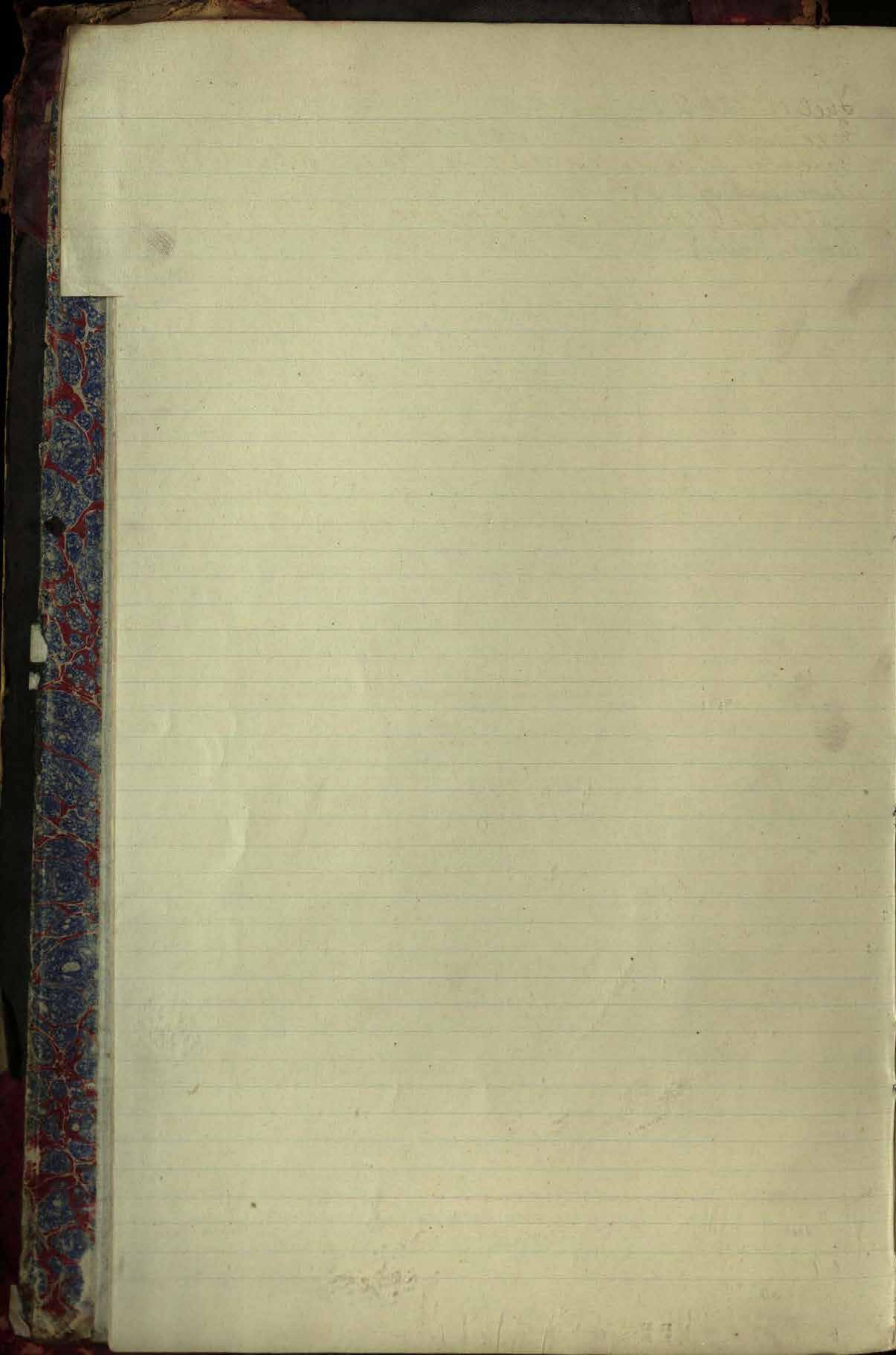
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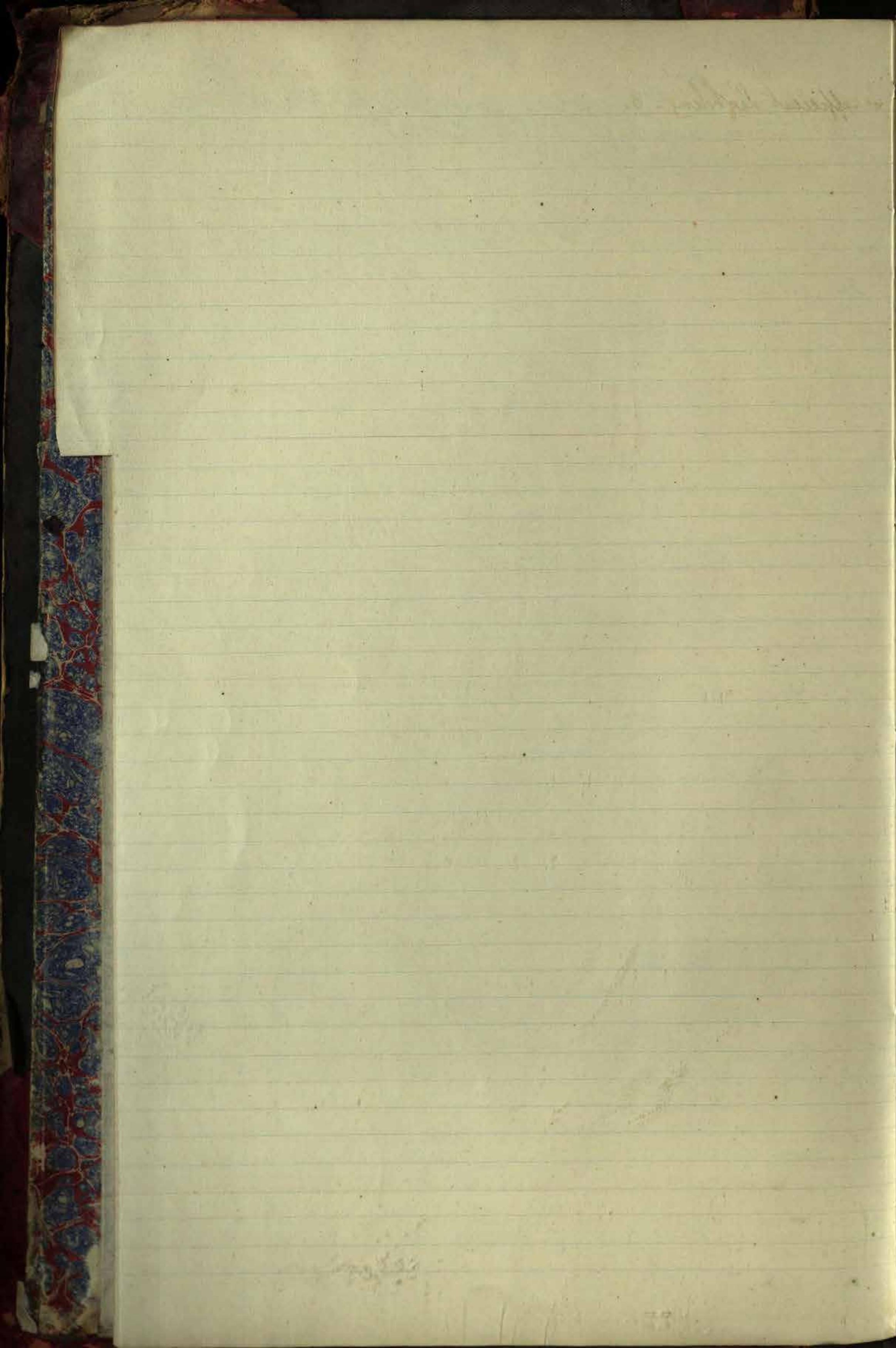
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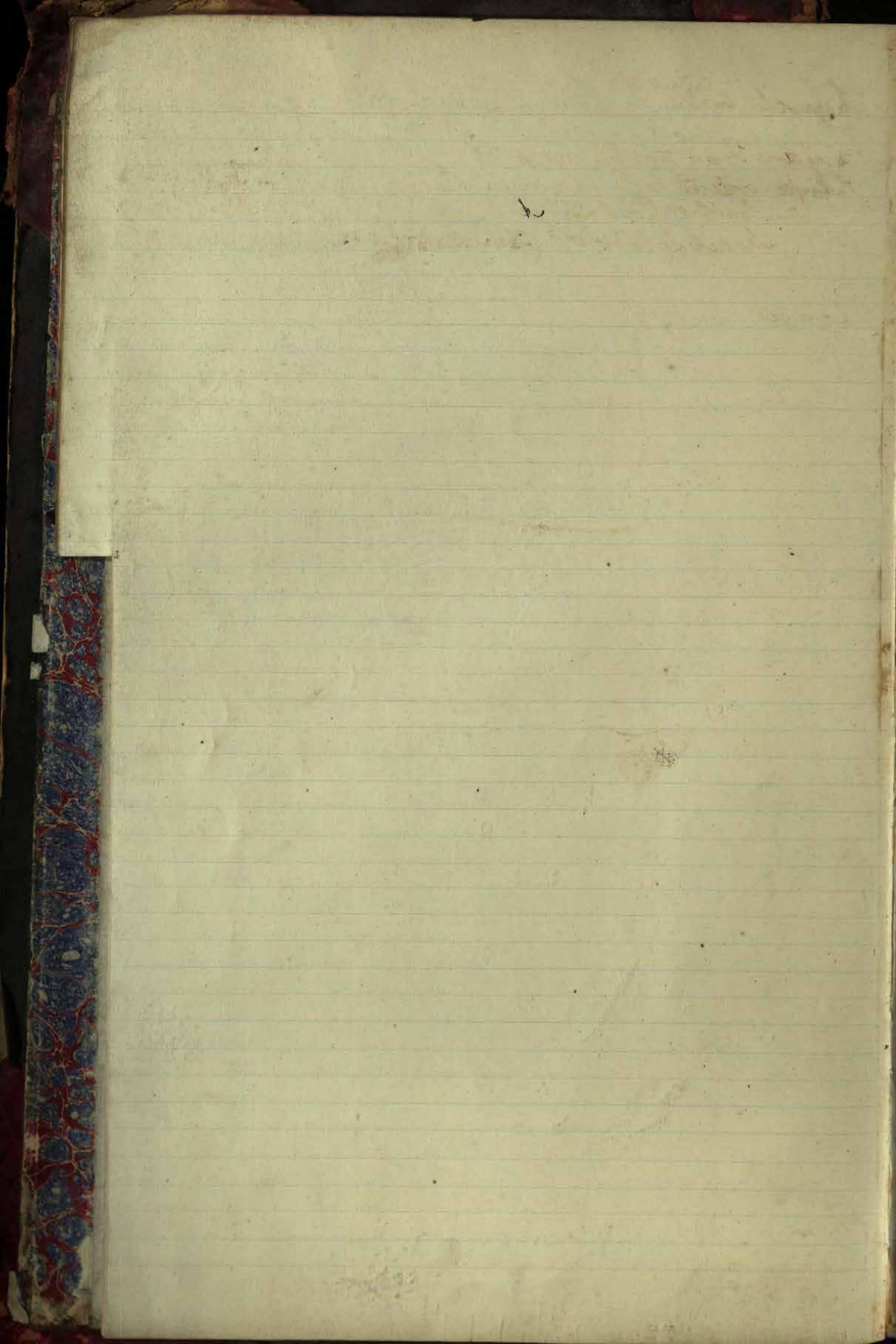

He stated he had no authority to allow such an overdraft and requested that a sufficient rate should be struck to cover the overdraft. Secretary reported that W Morris had made no payment of Paying Rate since _____ and that he had repeatedly applied in his abstract books with that effect.

REGULATIONS.

[These Regulations are issued as a Sample Set, duly approved by the Commissioners of National Education, for the consideration of the Local Authority, who, if they adopt them, may forthwith validly appoint one half of the School Attendance Committee, and furnish to the Office of National Education the Names, &c., of the Persons so appointed, when the Commissioners will appoint their half of the Committee.]

[Section 3 (1)
of the Act.]

LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

The provisions of the Irish Education Act, 1892, apply to every place which either is a Municipal Borough or is a Town or Township under Commissioners, and the Council or Commissioners of the place shall be the Local Authority of the place for the purposes of the Act.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE COMMITTEES.

In every place to which the compulsory clauses of the Act apply there shall be a School Attendance Committee, consisting of six, eight, or ten persons, as the Local Authority of the place may determine, one-half of whom shall be appointed by the Local Authority, and the remainder by the Commissioners of National Education.

2. The School Attendance Committee shall be appointed triennially, and Schedule 3.] the first Committee shall serve from the 1st day of January, 1894, to the 31st day of December, 1896.

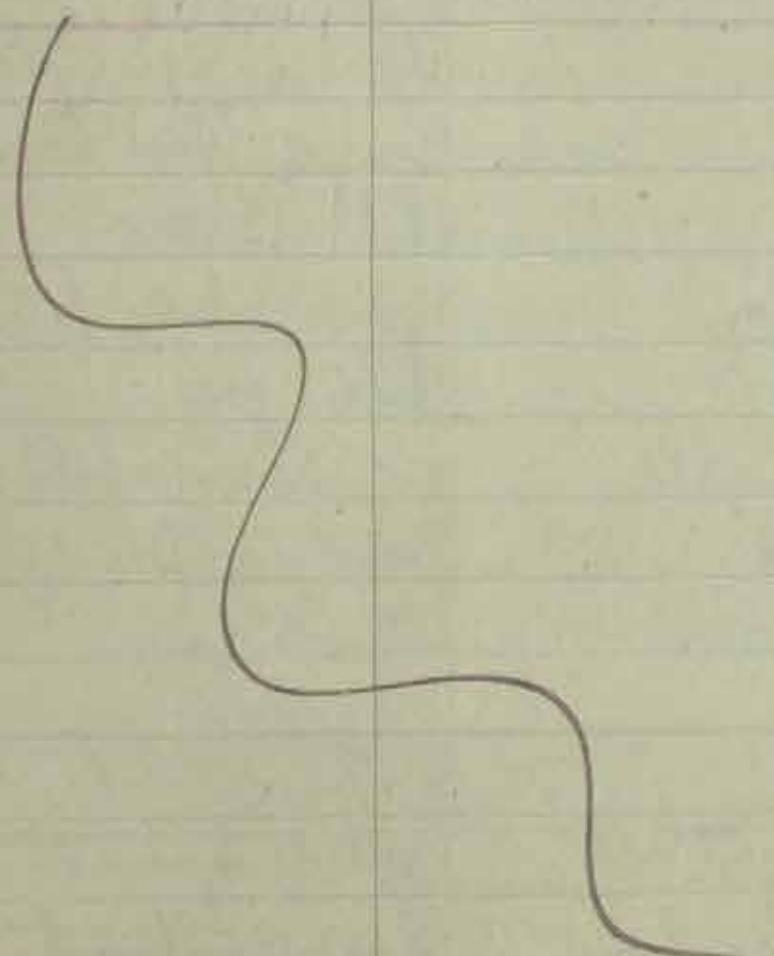

In accordance with a resolution of the Board at their meeting held on the 6th inst naming Dr Grealy, Mr N. Palmer and Mr J.J. Kirwan as a Committee to enquire into the expense of maintaining and cleansing the Roads and streets, and to make suggestions for a better system of check on the same. Committee met on the 21st inst. Present Dr Grealy, N Palmer and J.J. Kirwan Esqrs.

It was resolved* That this Committee recommend the Board to direct that the Boro' Surveyor shall see what men and carts are at work on the roads and streets each day. That the Town Steward keep the accounts of Wages (The Labour Book) and that same shall be certified as correct each week by the Boro Surveyor before the cheque to discharge it shall be laid before the Board for signature. That this cheque be in favor of the Boro Surveyor who shall pay the men, and that the weigh Dockets delivered to carters of broken stones be pinned to the weekly account.

That The Commsr foreman Mr Morris shall receive these weigh dockets from the carters and that before receiving any docket he shall see that the stones or other material referred to therein shall be duly unloaded and deposited on the road. To facilitate the carrying out of this check, and that he may exercise better supervision over the men employed in the repair of the roads and streets Mr Morris is to keep these men working on one street or road at a time. In this way he will be the better able to see the number of carts of stones delivered and take up the dockets for same. These dockets are to be handed daily either to the Boro Surveyor or to the Town Steward.

That the Town Steward lay out each morning for the scavengers the work they are to do setting out what streets or streets are to be cleansed (and the several streets should be done regularly), and having laid out the work he is to see that it is done.

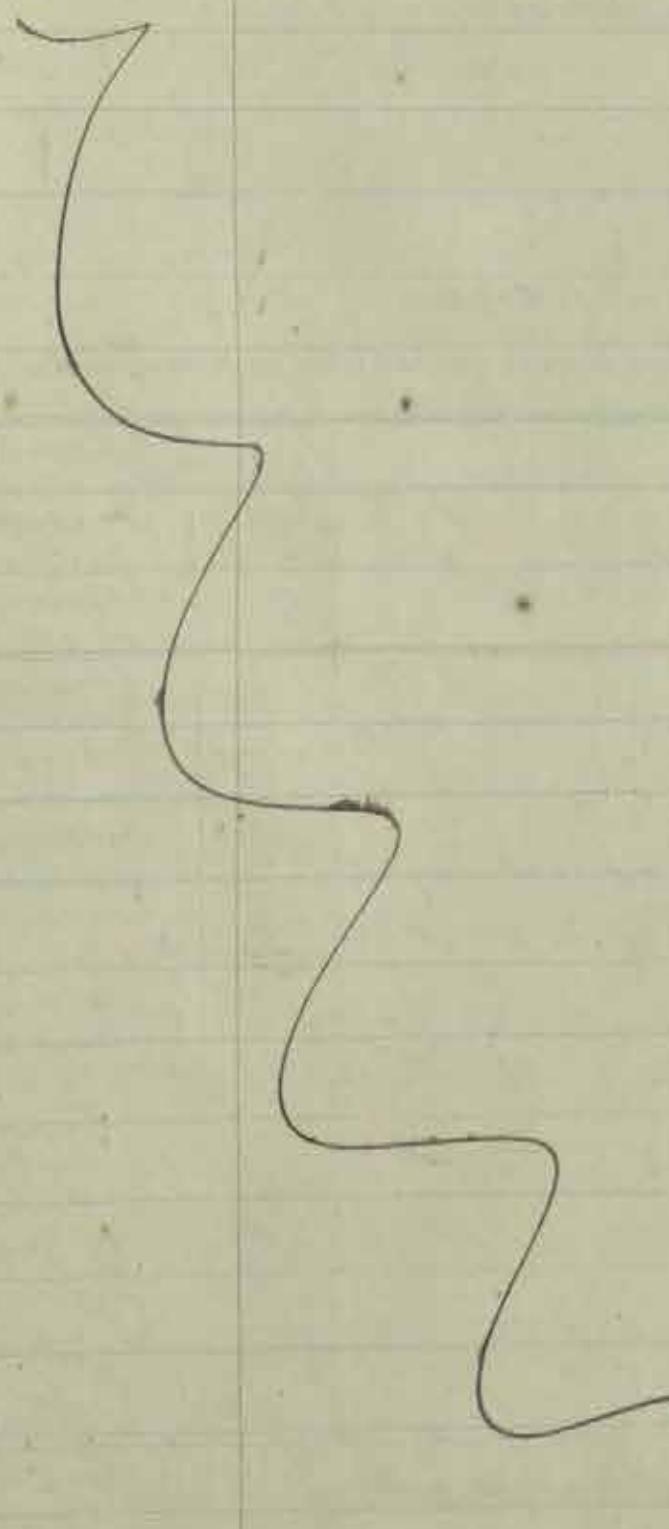

Borough of Galway

Bye-Laws for Regulating Hackney Carriages made by the Galway Town Improvement Commissioners on the 4th day of March 1897 to be in force from the first day of May 1897.

1. The first Monday in May in each year shall be the annual licensing day.
2. There shall be paid to the Galway Town Improvement Commissioners or to any person appointed by them for every Hackney Carriage, Coach or Car license the sum of 2½ by every proprietor, and the sum of 4 by every driver, and it shall not be lawful for a Proprietor to allow to be driven, or for a driver to drive a Carriage, or coach or car within the limits of the borough of Galway without the licenses having been paid.
3. The licenses shall be in force for one year if granted on the annual licensing day, otherwise until the next annual licensing day.
4. The requisition for any license for any Hackney carriage, Coach or car shall be in the form below in Schedule C hereunto annexed.
5. The Licenses shall be in the forms No. 2 & 3 in said Schedule.
6. No driver shall be of an age less than sixteen years. He shall be of decent apparel and of good and civil behaviour.

We find that the Hydrant placed in Mr Palmers yard for use in case of Fire is not and has never been used. The increase of £3 was assessed in this case owing to the fact that Mr Palmer works an Engine in the yard and feeds stock there.

We also find that there is a water closet in Messrs Palmers Office which was not taken into consideration when the Contract rates were being considered.

We therefore recommend that the £2 originally charged for the Hydrant be discontinued and that the Messrs Palmer be charged £3 per annum for the water used in the yard and 4/- per annum in respect of the Water closet.

re MR PERSSE'S OBJECTION.

As to this case we beg to say that the Contract Rate on the Distillery has not been increased.

The Contract Rate on the Malthouse has been increased by £1-10-0 in consequence of the establishment of a bottling store there. We recommend that this increase be maintained.

A new contract has been assessed on Mr Persse in respect of the stables at Nun's Island £1-10-0. This we also recommend to be retained.

REPORT of the Roads and Streets Committee on the subject of the repair and maintenance of the Streets in the hands of the Council, the system of cleansing and scavenging same and the employment of staff and plant suggested to be obtained in connection with same.

R E P O R T.

Your committee beg/ to report that they have carefully considered the questions referred to them and have come to the conclusion that there is room for great improvement in the present system of repairing and cleansing the Streets in the hands of the Council both as regards the class of men employed and the ~~number~~ description of horses, carts etc. They are also of opinion that there is not sufficient supervision over the scavenging staff and that the amount of work done is in consequence, not by any means proportionate to the staff employed or the expenditure incurred.

Your Committee are of opinion that in addition to the Foreman it would be advisable to employ a ganger who would work with the staff and having authority over them would see that a fair amount of work would be done as there is reason to believe that under the present system there is much loitering and waste of time which could be and ought to be prevented.

Your Committee therefore beg/ to recommend:-

1. That the Council should procure its own horses and also carts suitable for scavenging work. It is considered that the Yard belonging to the Council at the Bewling Green could be utilized for stable accommodation, and it is recommended that Mr Morris should be placed in charge of the horses and that his wages be raised to £1 per week.

It is recommended that the scavenging staff be reduced from 15 men at 13/- per week to 11 men ~~at 13/- per week~~. That the Town Steward be instructed to get a good class of men and that the staff be placed under a working ganger who should be instructed to report at once to the Town Steward any negligence or bad working on the part of any of the staff.

3. That a stone breaker be procured *Mr Morris to ascertain cost and report.*

Your Committee is strongly of opinion that the new plant recommended to be obtained would affect a substantial saving to ~~the~~ the Council, but, of course, their recommendations are subject to the approbation of the engineer as to the question of cost.

It is the opinion of the Committee that a Bye Law should be made by the Council dealing with the nuisance of throwing out refuse, papers etc on the streets at night and recommend that either ash-bins such as are in use in other towns be procured or that a cart be sent out every morning to collect dust, papers etc from the shops and other premises. The present practice is not only objectionable but dangerous as papers flying about are liable to frighten horses and thus endanger life.

The question of the Town Clerks salary and the great increase in his duties cast upon him by the Local Government (Ireland) Act. 1898, having been referred to us for our report.

We beg to state that we have given the subject our most careful consideration, and having regard to the arduous and important duties ~~which~~ he has to discharge, which have been vastly increased by the late Local Government Act, we are of opinion that his salary is quite inadequate. For many years he has been receiving a salary of only £100- a year, whilst in all other towns in Ireland, even those considerably less in population and valuation, the salaries are much greater.

To show the disparity we give a few instances:-

We have at our meeting today given the most careful consideration to the question whether the Galway Technical Institute should be embraced in the scheme of Technical Instruction that is now being formulated by the County Council, and we have arrived deliberately at the unanimous decision that Galway should be permitted to retain the independent position it has successfully maintained for the last nine years. The advantages and disadvantages of such a position have been laid carefully before us, and we have no hesitation in stating that such a scheme would never work successfully. If Galway City were only beginning now with the rest of the County we should gladly join in with the venture but the Galway school has worked successfully for a number of years, and we believe that some consideration is due to us on that account. No such measure of success has heretofore attended any effort made by the County in this direction. We have willingly levied the maintenance amount permissible under the Technical Instruction Acts 1889 & 1891 for a long period of time. And we believe it proper to declare at this juncture that if the management of the school is taken from us and transferred to the County Council we shall feel in future obliged however indeed reluctantly to refuse any contribution from the rates towards its maintenance. If our independence from the County Council scheme will be sanctioned by the Dep. of Technical Instruction we declare our willingness to co-operate in every way towards the success of the County scheme by the interchange of teachers and in any other manner that may be practicable.

With reference to previous correspondence and to the Meeting of the Technical Instruction Committee of the Urban Council at the Galway Technical Institute on the 19th ultimo, at which the Assistant Secretary in respect of Technical Instruction was present, I have to say that after further consideration of the question as to "Whether the Galway Technical Institute should be embraced in the scheme of Technical Instruction that is now being formulated by the County Council", the Department have come to the conclusion that under the special circumstances of the case the Galway Technical Institute may be considered independently of the County Scheme, and that it may be dealt with as part of a separate Scheme for the Urban District of Galway which may be promoted by the Urban District Council.

The Department greatly regret that, owing to the attitude of your Committee, co-operation between the Urban and County Councils in a Scheme of Technical Instruction has been found impossible.

DUTIES OF TOWN STEWARD.

CLEANSING STREETS. To have a general supervision over scavengers, carmen, and all roads not in hands of a Contractor, and have their time, as well as quantities of broken stones, gravel, etc., kept correctly in weekly labour book. To see that the debris of the town is deposited on the place indicated by the Roads and Streets Committee at Fairhill or elsewhere.

To report periodically on the state of the eave shoots and downpipes throughout the town, and prosecute when necessary.

FAIRS AND MARKETS. General superintendence of Toll Collectors, and see that they are at their gaps at proper hours. To check their books and ledger amount weekly. Same as regards fairs, and to employ additional men if necessary to assist Collectors at the different gaps.

HORSES AND CARTS. Purchase and keep an account of hay and oats supplied for the Council's horses, and to submit Quarterly an account of the maintenance of each horse; also to see that the horses, carts, etc., are properly kept.

To see that all accounts for goods supplied on his order are furnished quarterly and all bills due by the Council to be looked over and certified by the Town Steward and lodged in the Secretary's office a week previous to each Finance Meeting.

To see that the town watchmen discharge their duties properly and report weekly.

See that the Watchmen report to him and that he report weekly number of public lamps not lighted throughout the town or put out before the hours specified in contract.

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen—Your Committee, accompanied by your Engineer, visited the slob lands at Fair Hill, and beg to report as follows:

There is a breach in the foreshore embankment, through which the tide flows and floods the slob lands. The width of the breach is only about 80 yards. We recommend that this breach be embanked by a stone and earth embankment strengthened by piles being driven into the gravel. The height of the embankment will not, in any place, exceed eight feet.

There are two culverts under the Pier Head with tidal flaps, and the tidal flats will require to be repaired.

If the tide is excluded from the slob lands, it is a large area that can immediately be made into valuable land by Drainage.

We recommend that the entire ground be fenced in. We recommend that in future all dirt be deposited in the vicinity of the proposed Dams.

We have requested your Engineer to prepare Estimates for the various works proposed with the view of applying for a loan in the event of your Council approving of our recommendations. Your Committee are of opinion that the enhanced value of the lands when reclaimed will more than repay the instalments on the proposed loan.
